United States. There were also many participants on the Spanish boat. The Mexican boat was not bad at all.

The organization has been excellent. For example, there were uniformed and trained volunteers who guided and supported those attending the events. On the other hand, the competitions have taken place in iconic places. For example, archery was held at Les Invalides. Fencing and taekwondo at Le Grand Palais. And horse riding at the Versailles Palace. These are venues with a great history, truly unique and extremely beautiful. And, without a doubt, this makes the Olympics even more enjoyable.

Most of the medals have been won by participants from developed countries. France has set an example of how to make the Olympic Games more sustainable. For now, they set a very high standard for future host countries, and I am very pleased to have been able to attend.
